To comply with copyright law, the institution <u>can</u>:

- Scan or copy articles that represent a small portion of the entire course material
- Link to articles in a library database
- Scan or copy a portion of a book that represents a small portion of the entire course material and less than 10% of the book's total content
- Scan or copy items that are no longer copyrighted (public domain)
- Provide print and multimedia reserves at the Circulation Desk (Examples: entire books, films, and non-print resources such as kits)

To comply with copyright law, the institution <u>cannot</u>:

- Keep a scanned or copied item on reserve repeatedly without requesting permission from the copyright holder and making payment if required
- Scan or copy a collection of articles or book portions that replace a course textbook (This is legally considered a classroom anthology and should be handled as a course pack.)
- Scan or copy large portions of a journal issue or more than 10% of a book without requesting permission from the copyright holder and making payment if required
- Scan or copy documents intended to be consumable (workbooks, exercises, standardized tests, test booklets, and answer sheets, etc.)
- Place interlibrary loan items or rented films on reserve
